



Greater Cleveland Council Unit Commissioner Commitment to Scouting

The insignia that you wear as a commissioner displays a wreath around Scouting's trefoil, representing your commission to serve chartered organizations in the operation of Cub Scout Packs, Boy Scout Troops and Venturing Crews. This distinguishes you from others in the Scouting movement and confers special responsibilities upon you. The role of Unit Commissioner in Greater Cleveland Council requires that you commit to certain activities, listed below:

In the first ten days: Complete your Volunteer Leader Registration form as a Commissioner and turn it into your District Commissioner.

Complete online Youth Protection Training (or attend, where offered). A link to the online training can be found at the Greater Cleveland Council website.

In the first 90 days: With your District Commissioner (or Assistant District Commissioner), visit each of your units at least once and complete the Unit Commissioner worksheet.

In the first 180 days: Attend Unit Commissioner Basic Training

Periodic duties: Monthly, maintain some form of contact with each assigned unit.

Monthly, invite and accompany unit leaders from each assigned unit to District Roundtables.

Monthly, attend the District Commissioner meeting.

At least bimonthly, visit each assigned unit to observe the unit in action. (Unit meeting, unit committee meeting, or unit activity)

At least quarterly, complete and turn in (to District Commissioner) a Unit Commissioner worksheet for each assigned unit.

Annually, attend at least one advanced commissioner training course and/or unit leader training course.

Annually, participate in the membership inventory to kick off the unit rechartering process for each assigned unit. Monitor and assist as needed with the unit rechartering process.

Annually, participate in the unit recharter presentation at the end of the rechartering process.

As needed duties: Invite and accompany unit leaders for each assigned unit to Council and District training activities (such as Baden Powell Institute)
